

# Face Mask Sewing Instructions


This Face Mask is intended to be worn by a person who is coughing or sneezing in order to contain spray of saliva - **NOT** for protection of the wearer from Corona Virus.

Printing Instructions: This pattern is designed to fit on 8.5" x 11" paper. To print, be sure that your printer scaling is set to "none," "actual size," or "100%" to ensure proper sizing. Because all printers are different, check the 1" measurement on the pattern piece pages to be certain the pattern is sized properly.

The following instructions will guide you through the entire process of making the *Face Mask*. All seams are sewn with a ¼-inch (6 mm) seam allowance. Be sure to read through the instructions and follow each step.

When finished, wash masks in hot water and dry in a hot dryer. Before removing the masks from the dryer, wash your hands with soap for 30 seconds. Take the masks out one-by-one, reshape, and seal in individual plastic bags.

*Drop masks off at the receptacle outside Hannah Johnson Fabrics, 4511 E. Superior Street.*



**Step 1:** Cut four Mask pieces following the grain line. Two will be for the mask and two for the mask lining. *Use woven cotton fabric only.*



**Step 2:** Stitch two mask pieces right sides together along the nose and chin seam. Repeat for the lining. Clip the curves and press the seam allowances to one side.



**Step 4:** Pin the mask and mask lining right sides together along the top and bottom edges. The mask and mask lining seam allowances should lay in opposite directions to reduce bulk. Stitch. Clip the curves.



**Step 6:** Turn the mask right side out and press flat, following the seamline. Topstitch 1/8 inch from the top edge.



**Step 7:** Turn each back edge along the fold line, enclosing the elastic inside the channel. Zigzag along the raw edge to secure. **DO NOT** stitch over the elastic. Tie the elastic ends together and draw the knot into one of the channels.

Use a permanent marker to draw an arrow along one of the channels to indicate the top (See Illustration).
